

How to use I-CAN! to Create Divorce Step 3 Forms



Follow these steps

- Be sure to print or save the PDF file with your password so you can re-enter if there are any disruptions
1. Select your language preference, video preference and then select the Module you want to complete.
 2. The next screen will give you a description of the module. Click "Next" and then choose "Create a username and password".
 3. At the end of the tutorial and disclaimer, enter your first and last name and click "Next". I-CAN! will create a unique password for you. Be sure to print or save the PDF file with your password so you can re-enter if there are any disruptions.
 4. If you want to re-enter a module using a user you have created, select "Log in with my password" and then enter in your password. You will be taken back to the module with your responses already filled in.

What does I-CAN! do?

I-CAN! will fill out the forms for you by asking you simple questions and putting your answers on the court forms in the correct place. I-CAN! will print all of the forms that are necessary for your individual situation. I-CAN! will also print instructions to tell you what to do with your forms, and how the court process works.

Who can use the Divorce Step 3 module?

CA Divorce Step 3

Users

- A spouse who initiated a divorce, whether or not the other spouse responded
- A spouse who responded to a divorce

I-CAN! Divorce is not for those who own property or have other assets (house land, pension, stocks, a business), or have many debts. I-CAN! Divorce is not for those who want an annulment legal separation.

How to go through the Divorce Step 3 Module

Enter the following information

User Scenario 1: A wife divorcing her husband; husband did not file a response; they have children together.

1. Your name is "My Name", your age is 26 and you want to restore your name to "My Maidenname"
2. Your address is "111 My Street, My City, CA 11111", your phone number is "999-999-9999", and your email is "myemail@address.com". Your address has not changed.
3. Your spouse's name is "My Spouse". He never changed his name.
4. Your spouse's address is "222 Spouse Street, Spouse City, CA 22222"
5. Your case number is 1234567890 and you are the petitioner.
6. You served your spouse with the petition on 10/10/2006. Your spouse did NOT respond. You do not want to change anything since your preliminary *Declaration of Disclosure*. You served your spouse with the preliminary on 10/10/2006 by personal service. You have NOT served the final and you would like to waive it.
7. Spousal Support is an issue in your case. You and your spouse were married 5 years and 5 months. Your standard of living during your marriage is "Explanation 1". You would like to receive spousal support on the 15th of every month.
8. Property orders are an issue in your case.
9. You have minor children with your spouse.
10. Your first child is "Child One". He was born 10/10/2001. Your second child is "Child Two". She was born 10/10/2002. Both of them live in the US.
11. You want sole legal custody and sole physical custody with specific visitation.
12. You want the other parent to have visitation on the 1st and 3rd weekends of the month. Visitation begins 5pm on Friday and ends 5pm on Sunday starting 10/10/2007. You also want the other parent to have visitation on his birthday beginning at 9am and ending at 9pm every year.
13. You do not want to specify vacation time with the children. Vacations can be outside of California and the US. The other parent does not need prior written consent to travel with the children.
14. You want to take the children both to and from the visits. The children will be picked up and dropped off at "Visitation address" in "Visitation city".
15. You do not want the visits with the other parent to be supervised. You do not think that the other parent might take the children without your permission.
16. Child support is an issue in your case. You want your spouse to pay you on the 1st and 15th of each month. You are the mother of the children.
17. You do not want the order to be based on what each party is capable of earning.
18. Neither you nor your spouse receives welfare. You estimate that your spouse makes \$4000 per month and you make \$2000 per month.
19. Attorney Fees and costs are an issue included in your case. You paid \$400 by cash and you owe \$200. "Attorney Name" charges \$150 per hour.
20. You paid \$200 in clerk fees, \$60 in process server fees and \$10 in copy fees.
21. You live in Orange County.

Variations to try: Try answering that your spouse filed a response to the petition.

User Scenario 2: A husband who responded to a divorce; they do not have any children.

1. Your name is "My Name" and you are 26 years old. You never changed your name
2. Your address is "333 My Street, My City, CA 33333". This is NOT the address you used previously. You moved there 10/10/2007.
3. Your spouse's name is "Spouse Name". She wants to change her name back to "Spouse Maidenname".
4. Her address is "111 Spouse Street, Spouse City, CA 1111"
5. Your case number is 1234567890. You are the respondent.
6. You first appeared for this case on 11/11/2006.
7. You served your initial Declaration of Disclosure on your spouse on 10/20/2006 by personal service. You served your final Declaration of disclosure on your spouse on 7/7/2007 by mail.
8. Spousal support is an issue included in your case. You were married 10 years and 10 months. Your standard of living while living with your spouse was "Explanation 1". You will pay spousal support to your spouse on the 15th of each month.
9. Property orders are included in your case.
10. Attorney Fees and costs are an issue included in your case. You have paid \$600 so far by check. You do not currently owe any money to your attorney, named "My Attorney". She charges \$100 per hour.
11. You have paid \$100 in clerk fees, \$30 in service of process fees,
12. Your case is in Orange County.
