

How to use I-CAN! to Create Summary Dissolution Forms



Follow these steps

- Be sure to print or save the PDF file with your password so you can re-enter if there are any disruptions
1. Select your language preference, video preference and then select the Module you want to complete.
 2. The next screen will give you a description of the module. Click "Next" and then choose "Create a username and password".
 3. At the end of the tutorial and disclaimer, enter your first and last name and click "Next". I-CAN! will create a unique password for you. Be sure to print or save the PDF file with your password so you can re-enter if there are any disruptions.
 4. If you want to re-enter a module using a user you have created, select "Log in with my password" and then enter in your password. You will be taken back to the module with your responses already filled in.

What does I-CAN! do?

I-CAN! will fill out the forms for you by asking you simple questions and putting your answers on the court forms in the correct place. I-CAN! will print all of the forms that are necessary for your individual situation. I-CAN! will also print instructions to tell you what to do with your forms, and how the court process works.

Who can use the Summary Dissolution module?

- User who wants to divorce using summary dissolution

I-CAN! can help you file for Summary Dissolution if you and your spouse want to be divorced AND you have no children together, have been married only for a short time (5 years or less), don't own very much, don't owe very much and have no disagreements about how to divide up your belongings and debts.

With Summary Dissolution, you will not have to appear in court, but you will file your papers with the court.

How to go through the Summary Dissolution Module

Enter the following information

User Scenario One: User wants to divorce using summary dissolution

1. Check that everything is true on the first screen and that you agree to everything on the second screen
2. You are the wife, your name is "My Name" and your address is "111 My Street, My City, CA 11111" your phone number is 999-999-9999 and your email address is myemail@address.com
3. You want to change your name back to "My Maidenname"
4. Your spouse's name is "Spouse Name", his address is "222 Spouse Street, Spouse City, CA 22222" and he never changed his name
5. You were married 1/1/2006 and separated 1/1/2007
6. You have NOT been involved in any other court cases with your spouse
7. You have the following separate property:
 - a. Accounts
 - i. Account One, worth \$1000, yours
 - ii. Account Two, worth \$2000, your spouse's
 - b. Separate property you owe money on
 - i. Separate Property One, worth \$3000, you owe \$300, yours
 - ii. Separate Property Two, worth \$4000, you owe \$400, your spouse's, it is a car
 - c. Separate property you bought and paid in full
 - i. Separate Property Three, worth \$5000, yours, it is a car
 - ii. Separate Property Four, worth \$6000, your spouse's
8. You have the following community property
 - a. Accounts
 - i. Community Account One, worth \$7000, \$5000 to you, \$2000 to your spouse
 - ii. Community Account Two, worth \$8000, \$3000 to you, \$5000 to your spouse
 - b. Community Property you owe money on
 - i. Community Property One, worth \$900, you owe \$90, your will receive it
 - ii. Community Property Two, worth \$1000, you owe \$100, your spouse will receive it
 - c. Community Property you bought and paid in full
 - i. Community Property Three, worth \$1100, you will receive it
 - ii. Community Property Four, worth \$1200, your spouse will receive it
9. You have the following community debts
 - a. Debt One, \$1300, you will pay it
 - b. Debt Two, \$1400, your spouse will pay it
10. You live in Orange County

Variations to try: Try adding information about a court case between you and your spouse. Try adding different separate property, community property and debts.
